Common Core Literacy Scaffolding Questions

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Note to teachers and parents: The standards listed here are taken from the Common Core Standards: *Grades 6-12, Literacy in History/Social Studies, Science, & Technical Subjects* from the subset of standards for grades 6-8. Teachers, please note that these questions are designed only to provide a very basic literacy scaffold and to provide examples. There is plenty of room for you to add your creativity and use your expertise to develop "why" questions and to help students make connections to other texts.

The questions below should be answered using a complete sentence and with textual evidence from the reading. The questions for the Preface are answered as examples.

Preface

1. Based on a modern measurement, how tall is Mount Everest?

Sample Answer: Based on modern measurements, Mount Everest is "29,029 feet" tall.

2. What role did the Sherpa play in climbing Mount Everest?

Sample Answer: The Sherpa were native peoples who "carried months' worth of supplies" while acting as porters for the climbers.

Text Analysis Questions

In his memoir, *View from the Summit: The Remarkable Memoir from the First Person to Conquer Everest*, Sir Edmund Hillary wrote of a hardship that he suffered while descending a mountain several years after he had climbed Everest:

I was tied inside my sleeping bag, quite unable to move and suffering from awful claustrophobia. Then followed a long period of semi consciousness, of heat and extreme discomfort, of swinging and bumping.

I have had a number of occasions when I suspected I might be close to death but this was the only time I can remember feeling that it might perhaps be easier to die and I simply couldn't make any effort to survive...I was suffering from severe dehydration which caused a swollen tongue with deep cracks across it (p. 122).

Prompt: Sir Edmund Hillary climbed mountains for fun and adventure. Given what you have read in this excerpt and in *All About Sir Edmund Hillary*, how far should people push themselves in pursuit of sporting and adventure achievements? In other words, at what point should someone "turn around and head back?" while on a dangerous adventure? Include a clear thesis in your answer, textual evidence from the book, and a hypothetical or real situation a sport other than mountain climbing in your answer.


