Common Core Literacy Scaffolding Questions

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Note to teachers and parents: The standards listed here are taken from the Common Core Standards: *Grades 6-12, Literacy in History/Social Studies, Science, & Technical Subjects* from the subset standards for grades 6-8. Teachers, please note that these questions are designed only to provide a very basic literacy scaffold and to provide examples. There is plenty of room for you to add your creativity and use your expertise to develop "why" questions and to help students make connections to other texts.

The questions below should be answered using a complete sentence and with textual evidence from the reading. The questions for the Preface are answered as examples.

1. What is an example of one of the "firsts" that the presidency of Barack Obama represented?

Sample Answer: Barack Obama "was the first president who was born in Hawaii."

2. What is one thing that Barack Obama accomplished either before or after his presidency? Sample Answer: Barack Obama "had written two best-selling books" before he became president.

Prompt: In 2004, when Barack Obama was a state senator from Illinois, he gave a speech in support of the Democratic nominee for president, Senator John Kerry, at the Democratic National Convention. This speech started Barack Obama's career as a national political figure. Read the passage below and using what you have read in *All About Barack Obama*, give an example of what Obama meant when he said "...in no other country on earth, is my story even possible."

I stand here today, grateful for the diversity of my heritage, aware that my parents' dreams live on in my two precious daughters. I stand here knowing that my story is part of the larger American story, that I owe a debt to all of those who came before me, and that, in no other country on earth, is my story even possible.

Tonight, we gather to affirm the greatness of our nation — not because of the height of our skyscrapers, or the power of our military, or the size of our economy. Our pride is based on a very simple premise, summed up in a declaration made over two hundred years ago: 'We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal. That they are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable rights. That among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.'


